Josmeyer, Alsace, France - Christophe Ehrhart

Having worked their vineyards on organic principles for many years, since 2000 Josmeyer has moved towards a full conversion to biodynamic culture in accordance with the conviction that "the pursuit of excellence in harmony with the earth" will express both terroir and varietal character more dramatically. In 2002, the Domaine got the full Biodynamic accreditation and since then have produced wine of great purity and finesse.

What is biodynamic viticulture?

Biodynamic viticulture does not use the herbicides or pesticides employed in conventional grape growing. By respecting the soil as a living element, it nurtures the vines, imbruding them with the mineral and organic trace elements that are such a rich part of it. Biodynamic viticulture also takes in consideration the pattern of lunar and cosmic rhythms. The soil is seen not simply as a support for vine growing, but as an organism in its own right.

Lowe Estate, Mudgee, New South Wales, Australia - Jane Wilson

Jane, originally from Oban in Scotland and who graduated as a vet, moved to Australia to follow her husband David Lowe and become a wine maker. Their winery is Mudgee and specializes in small batch wine making using innovative techniques both for themselves and contract clients. The winery has advanced the approach to quality wine production by planting dryland vineyard to produce lower yields of extremely high quality grapes.

Grant Burge, Barossa Valley, Australia - Grant Burge

Grant Burge Wines was formed in 1988 by Grant and his wife Helen and is based at the historic Moorooroo Cellars on the banks of Jacobs Creek in the heart of the Barossa Valley, 80 kilometres north of Adelaide. Grant's heritage traces back some 150 years to his great, great grandfather, John Burge, who emigrated from England to the area to make wine. 5 generations later Grant has established Grant Burge Wines as one of the top 10 privately owned wine companies in Australia.

Le Mas Juliette Cuvée Solane, Côteaux du Verdon, Provence, France 2007

Dry but elegant style of rosé with distinct raspberry aromas, hints of provincial herbs and a lovely fresh and mineral finish.

Pinot Noir Rosé Loica Vineyard, Viña Leyda, Chile 2006

Clean and fruity nose with a strong red fruit character of raspberries and red cherries, combined with citrus notes. Delicate and fresh palate, with a great concentration of red berries balanced by racy acidity.

Banyuls Rimage 'Les Clos de Paulilles', Roussillon, France 2006

Very rich sweet fortified red wine with prune, mocha, caramel and herby flavours, absolutely superb with chocolate desserts or strong cheeses.

Petit Manseng Doux, Cuvée St Clement, Cabidos, Comté Tolosan, France 2005

Deliciously sweet, with citrus and spice aromas, with plenty of honey on the palate.

Montbazillac 'Ancienne Cure' Dordogne, France 2005

Honey and marzipan dominate the palate with confied orange peel and spice characters.

Chablis, Domaine Gerard Tremblay Burgundy, France 2007/2008 £18.75
Gerard Tremblay is one of the top 10 producers in Chablis and is highly respected for his ability to express the terroir of its wines. The Domaine is modest in size and their winemaking style is very subtle. Dry and crisp, with subtle fruit flavours of pear and citrus fruits, typical long mineral finish.

Sancerre, Domaine de la Villaudiere, Loire, France 2007 £17.95
A typical nose of cut grass giving way to fresh gooseberry flavours and typical citrus characters.

Fleurie, Domaine Lardy, France 2007 £16.50
Made from Gamay, a delicious medium light bodied red with juicy black cherries and spicy characters.

Barbera d'Alba, Marchesi di Barolo, Piedmonte, Italy 2006 £19.75
Medium bodied with warm spicy and wild berry characters, light dusty tannins and a pleasant savoury finish.

Grande Cuvée, Comte de Dampierre, Champagne NV £42.50 £8.55
The Dampierre family have been closely tied with the region and the production of champagne ever since the seventeenth century. This Champagne is approachable, soft, very fruity and slightly biscuity, fresh and pleasant.

Brut Rosé 1er Cru, Comte de Dampierre, Champagne NV £55.00 £9.25
A distinctive salmon (or copper) colour. A nose full of fruit with strawberry, subtle raspberry and black currants aromas and flavours, very elegant and sophisticated.

Champagne Ruinart Brut NV £59.00
Fresh, and fruity with notes of white fruits. A vivacious and lively wine from the oldest Champagne house.

Ruinart Rosé Champagne, France NV £65.00
This is the oldest "Grande Marque" in Champagne and has a limited availability. It is most definitely one of the best NV rosé, it is packed with juicy raspberry and strawberry flavours, elegant and decadent, the bottle also looks good!

Dom Perignon 2000 £145.00
This cuvée is extraordinarily open and ripe – it hits the palate with such force it is easy to confuse its ripeness with sweetness but then, in Dom Perignon style, it tightens up immensely and finished with great race and refreshing dryness.
